Founded in 2004, Apoyo a Gente Emprendedora A.C. is a nonprofit organization committed to helping Mexicans bootstrap themselves out of poverty, and become financially independent for life.

The Educational Micro-Lending Project helps people either start their own businesses, or strengthen existing ones.

Apoyo works primarily in low-income neighborhoods in San Miguel de Allende, and in rural communities in the state of Guanajuato.




In 2022, we started a partnership the Midday Rotary Club in San Miguel de Allende.

It is our pleasure to introduce the 2023 Annual Report for The Educational Micro Lending Program.

We are immensely proud of our team who persevered with adaptability, passion, determination and innovation.

The Rotary-Apoyo EMLP provides financial services and business support to entrepreneurs in 7 Rural Villages and 8 Low income neighborhoods.



Over 126 local entrepreneurs were able to access pro-poor financial services and training in 2023.

This is more individual beneficiaries than any previous year and an outstanding achievement.




Furthermore, in 2023, 43 new entrepreneurs have joined our programme receiving free-interest loans to start their own small businesses and begin their journey out of poverty.

As a result, their children have increased access to food, healthcare and education, taking the total lives impacted to 720.

#### **OUR IMPACT**







During 2023, The Rotary-Apoyo program touched the lives of more than 300 entrepreneurs and their families all over the municipality of San Miguel de Allende.

In 2023, 126 adults participated in the Entrepreneur Business Workshops at the APOYO'S Training Center.

At the end of the workshops these entrepreneurs are able to administer their businesses, make well informed decisions, serve customers with quality, have a better presentation and increase sales. When they finished the workshops, they were given a recognition that certifies they have taken the training.

The Rotary-Apoyo EMLP Porgram seeks to empower poor entrepreneurs by increasing access to business credit, by making no-interest loans and, most importantly, by providing technical and leadership training. APOYO's support to new business owners enables them to realize their dreams, become the catalysts for positive economic and social change in their communities, and allow them to support their families.



#### **OUR STORIES**

This is Matilde

After attending the educational program on entrepreneurship, Matilde received an interest-free loan to buy a wheelbarrow to dedicate herself to selling corn in her rural community.

Matilde has a son who is deaf, Miguelito, who attends a special school in San Miguel.

Miguelito is the motor that drives Matilde. The profits from her business are used to purchase his medications, which are a bit expensive.

Matilde continues every day, investing time and passion in her small business, at the same time Matilde is part of a rural cooperative where they do embroidery work.

With a better income for their families, these women are part of an economic movement that will change our country from the base of the socio-economic pyramid.


